Bettering Bethany Church

Bethany Church is situated in the heart of Kenyon Estate of Little Hulton, Salford, Greater Manchester. The church has been operating for approximately 20 years and is run by the Reverend Sue Davidson and her husband along with a small number of volunteers.

The church is run on the kind donations of its congregation and the money it raises through the community events, occasionally it has been successful in obtaining local authority funding through the bidding process.



What did we do?

Five AmcoGiffen operatives spent three community impact days at the church to carry out essential maintenance.

- Reinstalling the letter 'n' on the sign
- Painting the front doors and the door surround
- Painting the columns and the strips from the floor to the roof
- Scraping the loose paint from the soffit
- Installing a small stone coper into the gap which was allowing water ingress
- Removing, repainting and re-fixing hanging baskets brackets
- Fixing and repainting the key-clamp handrail
- cleaning the gutters
- Repairing the light and resealing the windows
